



Merry Christmas

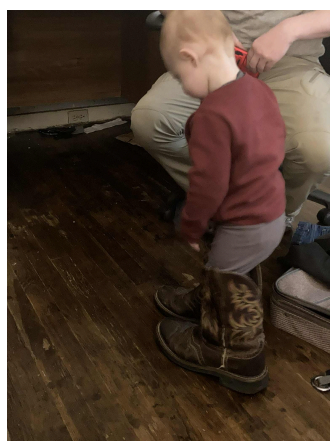
Overview
